# **Admissions Update**

The recruiting results for the class of 2018 are in and once again we have had a terrific yield! Of the 51 applicants from the Peninsula and South Bay this year, 31 were accepted and 10 will be matriculating. Of that total, local alumnae interviewed 32 of them; a record number for us. They are coming from the following public high schools: Abraham Lincoln in San Jose, Gunn and Paly in Palo Alto, Westmont in Campbell, Sequoia in Redwood City, Los Altos and Los Gatos High Schools, and Monta Vista in Cupertino. We also have two students coming from private schools: Kehillah Jewish High School and Sacred Heart Prep. Five of these schools are sending us students for the first time in recent history so that is also exciting. We are using our Club Book Awards Program strategically, to encourage applicants from schools we haven't heard from by building relationships with counselors and teachers

Of these newest Smithies, four were Early Decision which is another record. One of these ED students told us that she decided to apply ED after her interview with an alumna here,

which really confirms our mission to make a difference for Smith!

Chris Conklin '82, our Alumnae Admissions Coordinator, adds: I am SO grateful to my fabulous interviewers and I always welcome more alumnae who would like to do interviews or participate in recruiting in other ways. #### SF Botanical Garden Tour

On Saturday, May 10th, 14 Smithies enjoyed a lovely afternoon in San Francisco. We began with lunch at the De Young Museum Cafe and then walked over to the San Francisco Botanical Garden in Golden Gate Park. Mary Pitts, a Trustee of the Garden Society, gave us a fascinating private tour of the California native plants found in the Garden. Sue Ann Levin Schiff '69. Executive Director of the S.F. Botanical Garden Society, joined us as well. The Club hosted us for the tour's admission fees.



This 55-acre Garden includes specimens of more than 8,000 different kinds of plants from around the world. California itself has nearly 6,000 native plants, more than all other states combined, and the Garden offers a rare chance to see many of them in one place. In addition to its California Native Garden and century-old Redwood Grove, the Garden offers unique Mesamerican, Andean and Southeast Asian Cloud Forest collections, as well as the most significant magnolia collection for conservation purposes outside of China. It's the perfect place to stroll along meandering paths, taking in the buzzing bees, beautiful butterflies, and flowers in an amazing setting. If you haven't yet explored this wonderful resource, we highly recommend a visit soon!
