Smith has partnered with Mount Holyoke on this year's four part book series called Connecting Conversations. It features books on career change, women's leadership, entrepreneurship, and making the most of your twenties. Though not required for regular admission, Robin and Martha encourage prospective students to have an interview to supplement their application. On campus interviews are required of Ada candidates. Robin and Martha are available to arrange an interview and to meet with interested candidates. An informational tea for candidates will be held on Sunday, January 10 from 2-4 p.m. at the home of Elizabeth Chandler '87 at 3010 Torrington Road in Shaker Heights.

In an effort to share information about Smith's pre-collegiate summer programs with eligible eighth grade girls, Robin is reaching out to middle school counselors at schools around the city. If you are able to help her establish a connection with middle school counselors at a school, she would appreciate an introduction. Likewise, if you know of any sharp, promising eighth grade girls and high school students who would enjoy Smith's pre-collegiate programs, let her or Martha know or just have them contact her or Martha directly for more information. The 2016 programs include: Summer Science and Engineering (July 10-August 6), Women's Writing (July 10-July 23), Discovering Women's History (July 10- July 23), and a College Admissions Workshop (July 23-July 30). A link to apply will be available at <u>www.smith.edu</u> in late December, early January. Students requesting financial aid are encouraged to apply as early as possible. The science program is highly competitive and usually closes out before the end of March.
