Happy New Year. Thanks to all who came to the Holiday Party at the Cleveland Racquet Club. It was wonderful to see so many alumnae together enjoying one another's company. Musical entertainment was provided by the a capella group, Nightingale, featuring our own **Nancy Lee Jackson '84** and Cindy Langmack, daughter of **Marilyn Langmack '67**. They certainly helped get everyone into the holiday spirit. Sincere thanks to **Susan LaPine '68** and her husband Hal for facilitating our use of the club – it's been a wonderful venue for this event for the past two years.

We have a few exciting events planned for the spring. This year, our spring club-wide event is designed for families and friends. Mittie Jordan '75 has arranged for Kate Chenery Tweedy to visit Northeast Ohio from her home in Colorado for a book signing and discussion of Secretariat's Meadow: The Land, The Family, The Legend, a pictorial history of her family's legacy in horse breeding and racing. Our annual meeting in June will feature Becky Ruppert McMahon '89, executive director of the Cleveland Metropolitan Bar Association, speaking about her life and career. Candidates and Book Awards

Thanks to the valiant efforts of **Veselina Radeva '09** and **Martha Woerner '08**, 18 applicants from our region have applied to Smith. Cleveland is matching the pace set by Smith by finding more and more great applicants each year.

While most of our candidates must wait until late March to hear from Smith about their admissions decision, **Anna Von Bethmann-Hollweg**, a senior at Hathaway Brown, was admitted in December and will be attending Smith next fall as a member of the **class of 2021!** Three more young women from Cleveland submitted such outstanding applications that Smith has decided to let them know that they're admitted in late February. These students have not yet committed to attending Smith, but we'll be busy convincing them that it's the right choice.

Did you know that Smith runs several summer programs for high school girls? Topics range from writing and women's history to science and engineering. This is a great opportunity for young women to get a pre-college experience and see what Smith has to offer. Admissions are made on a rolling basis, but are due no later than May 1st. Summer on the Cuyahoga

It is currently "high season" for internships; students from the eight participating SOTC schools are furiously seeking summer employment in Cleveland. As of this writing, 35 employers have posted 58 positions and 443 students have submitted 1,395 applications. For Smith students alone, 45 students have submitted 104 applications. One Smith student has been hired to-date. **Jennie Kratz '18** will use Praxis funding to support her unpaid internship at The Diversity Center. In addition to the jobs posted on the SOTC website, the two "Smith only" internship opportunities at the Ingalls Library and Archive (part of the Cleveland Museum of Art) and Policy Matters Ohio will be offered again this summer.

Would you like to serve as a host to one of the SOTC interns? During the summer, Smith alumnae volunteers welcome and support the Smith interns. The Club pairs alumnae to provide a "co-host" experience that is low stress and highly rewarding.
