# Susan Bourque

Susan Bourque, the Esther

Susan Bourque came to Princeton in late October to address the Club. Many of you will remember Dr. Bourque as a government professor – she joined the faculty at Smith in 1970, right after she completed her Ph.D. at Cornell.

She gave us an overview of the new "Design for Learning," which is the college's mission statement and plan to address the changing needs of students in a global society.

Because the election was entering its final days of campaigning, we asked her if she would be willing to talk about that as well. She said that political scientists are notoriously bad at predicting elections, but she gave us quite an education on polling, how it reflects and does not reflect actual voter behavior, and what the then-current polls might suggest about the Presidential elections that were almost upon us.

Judy Burks and her husband hosted us in their gracious home in Princeton, and we enjoyed delicious baked goodies provided by several members.

Tica Simpson, our Club President, had to forcefully bring the discussion to an end at 9 pm, because we were on a roll, asking lots of questions and enjoying a very stimulating evening!
