WHAT DO YOU DO PROFESSIONALLY AND/OR WHAT ARE YOU INVOLVED WITH IN THE GREATER HARTFORD COMMUNITY? The first fifteen years of my marriage, we moved five times and produced five children. Each place we went I was active in the League of Women Voters. When I returned to West Hartford for the third time, I became president of the LWV and then went on the Town Council. In 1975 I became Mayor of the town for three terms. In 1981 I became the Deputy Majority Leader of the State Senate for two terms. While I was Mayor, I founded West Hartford's local access TV station–WHC-TV, Inc.

WHAT HAS BEING INVOLVED IN THE CLUB MEANT TO YOU? I was active in Fairfield and in San Francisco, where I was involved mainly with the Book Sale. In West Hartford, because of my busy political schedule, I have only attended a few times. I have always enjoyed renewing old friendships and finding new Smith friends.
