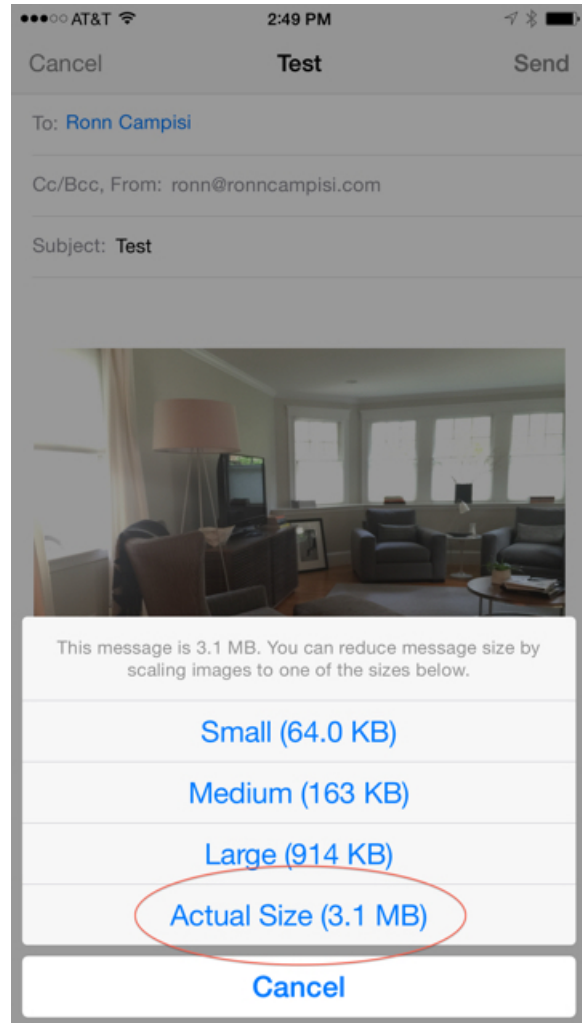


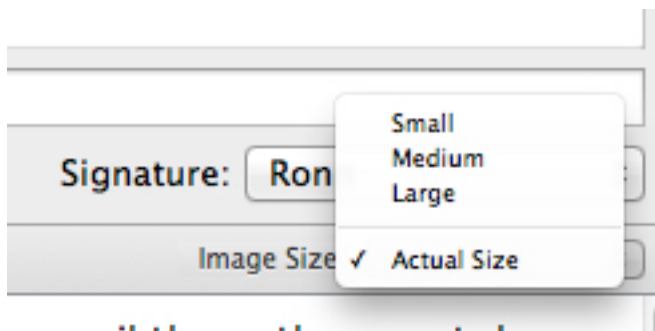
Photo Sending Tips

Today's iPhones and Android phones all take images that are high-enough resolution. BUT! When you email them, you must do so at the original size.

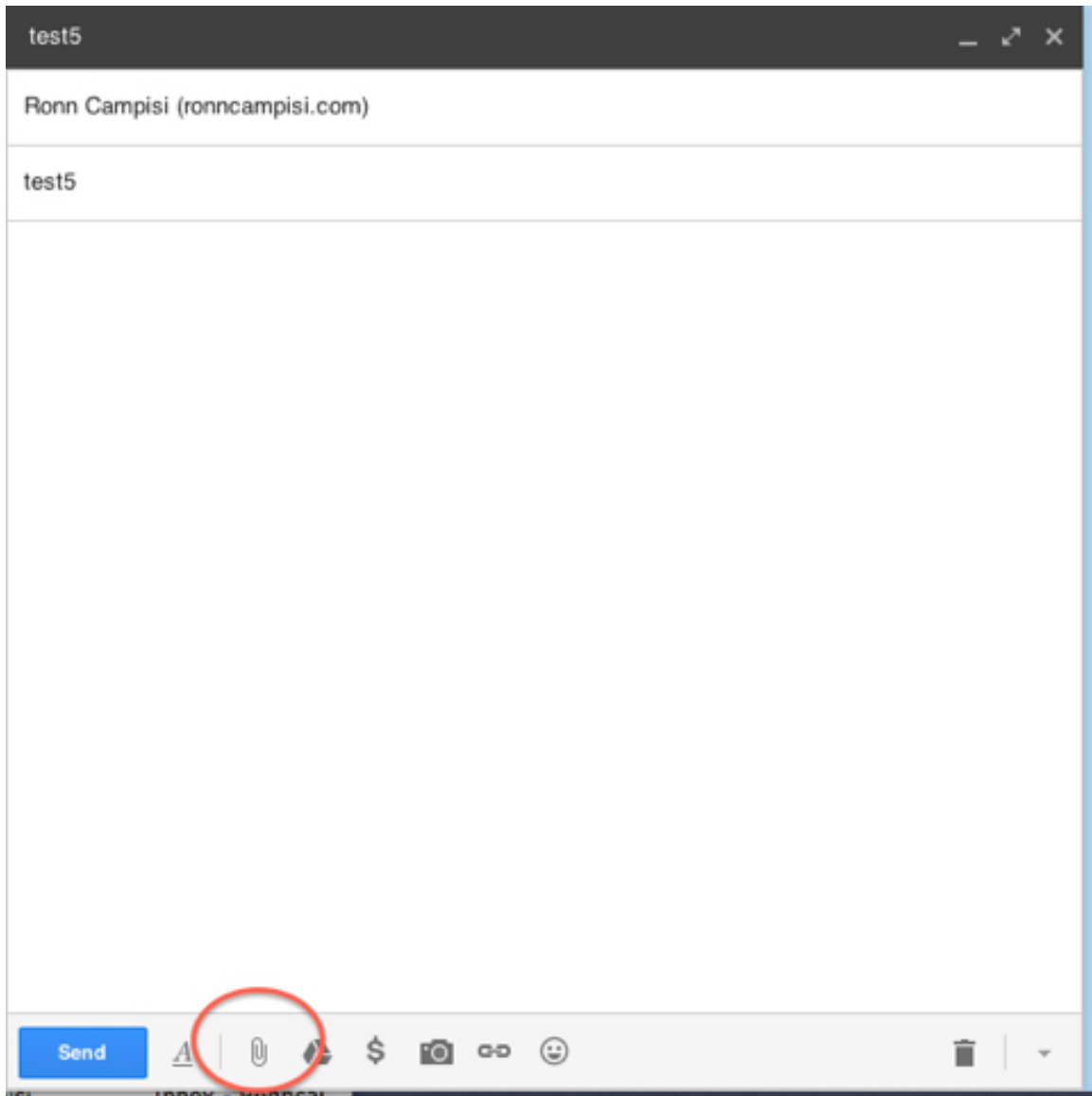
On an iPhone, just before you hit send, a dialogue pops up giving you an option to reduce the message size. "Actual Size" should always be chosen.



On a Macintosh computer, using Apple Mail, there is also option for image size:



Using Gmail on a Web browser, there is no option for specifying size. But if you choose “Attach files,” it will send it actual size:



If you choose the camera icon in the “Send” options, it will automatically reduce the size to about half the original size, which is not good!

Point-and-shoot cameras and other digital cameras all have different options for shooting resolutions. You should choose the highest-quality setting.

So, overall, **the ideal image size should be a minimum of 3MB.**
