Treasurer's Notes

Our fiscal year matches that of the college, starting on July 1st and ending a year later on June 30th. This year we began with \$5,062.45 in our account. The balance of the account at year end is \$4972.55.

As the year progressed, forty-seven alumnae joined the club as paying members (\$30). We also had nine Honorary members.

We ended the year with member donations for the scholarship fund totaling \$1,025.00. A check has been sent to the college for the North Shore Smith College Club's Endowed Scholarship fund for that amount.

Memorial gifts from the club of \$50 each were sent to the Scholarship fund. In some instances, these were augmented by "pass through" gifts in memory of certain deceased members. 
Young Alumnae Networking Coffee at FRANK




Book Awards
