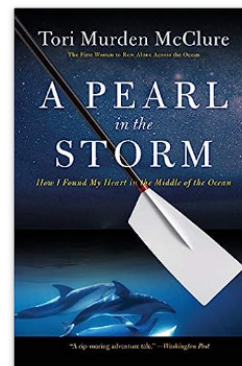
Girl Reading In The Orangery
