

Smith is one of only seven schools to have replaced loans with grants, and the only women's college! At a time when there is so much troubling news, this is all such positive news.

We are about to have a class Zoom account, thanks to Barbara Taylor who has offered to be the "manager" of the site for a trial of one year. There are already eight houses participating in their own regular zoom meetings via personal accounts. Having a class account means that we can have all-class virtual programs, minireunions, house gatherings—we are only limited by our imaginations! You will be hearing more from the Fund Team about **The Class of 1965 Endowed Scholarship Fund** as planning for our 60th starts to pick up steam. This is the fund we established in December, 1964, that has grown from \$15,659 to \$411,409 as of June 30, 2021, despite no gifts since 1974 AND the distribution of over \$350,000 in financial aid. Currently, we are providing support to two members of the class of 2024.

Well, that's just what we, the Class of 1965, did. That year we collected \$15,659 and established the Class of 1965 Scholarship Fund, an endowed fund managed by the college. At the end of the last fiscal year (June 30, 2021), our fund has grown to \$411,408! Most significantly, the fund annually spins off thousands of dollars of scholarship money that supports students with financial need.

Your gift to the Class of 1965 Scholarship Fund this year enables the fund to grow even larger and even more quickly. For Smith students, it's a gift that keeps on giving.

Just a few weeks ago, Kathy McCartney, Smith's president since 2013, announced that she is stepping down in June 2023. The search will now begin for Smith's 13th president.

As a letter from Alison Overseth '80, chair of the Board of Trustees, pointed out, Kathy's accomplishments are many. To us, none is as significant as her decision to eliminate student loans in favor of scholarships grants. No Smith student will graduate saddled with the kind of debt that constrains and controls so many women and men for years into the future. Imagine how wonderful it is that students can focus on their education rather than worrying about how they will repay their enormous college loans.

Kathy's legacy will endure for years to come. And so will our own, thanks to the support that each of us can give to Smith. Our donations—whether to the Smith Fund, which supports current operations, or to our Class of 1965 Scholarship Fund, which provides thousands of scholarship dollars every year—make sure that we, too, leave our mark on Smith College.

Despite the many years that have passed since we entered Smith, the friends we made at Smith, the accomplished faculty we learned from, the transformative experiences we had at Smith are as vivid as if we lived them yesterday. How fortunate we are to be able to offer those same life-enhancing experiences to the women following in our footsteps.
