President's Letter + Emily Farrell

Dear Smith Alumnae:

As another year gets under way for the Smith Club, it saddens me to share the news about **Kirsten Steinke '06**, our Vice President, who was in a car accident in September and is still recovering.

For those of you who have not followed our news via email or Facebook, Kirsten was on her honeymoon in New Zealand and, tragically, her husband was killed instantly in the accident. Kirsten suffered from injuries to her head, pelvis, ribs, and jaw and was in a coma for two weeks. Her memories are still scattered and she doesn't remember everything that happened. She spent more than a month in a New Zealand hospital before returning home to Colorado on October 23 to continue her treatment at a rehabilitation facility.

Kirsten is getting better every day and is improving faster than doctors had anticipated. Her father has referenced her Smith strength and spirit in his communications with the Club. Some of you may remember that Kirsten's parents, Jim and Gerri Steinke, hosted our holiday party in 2010. You'll also be glad to know that the Smith community in New Zealand offered their help and support to the Steinke family while they were there.

We will let you know how Smithies can help Kirsten as she continues her recovery. Thank you to those 85 women who have sent in your dues, additional support and Scholarship contributions. As of September 30th, the Club has collected \$3,425 in dues, \$1,240 in additional support and \$731 in Scholarship contributions. Because of your generous support, we have the opportunity this year to provide a variety of events and, in many cases, subsidize the cost for our members. Our hope is that these perks will not only increase the Club membership but also increase the attendance at our events.

At the Annual Meeting in June of this year, all club members in attendance approved a \$2,000 gift to the Smith College Current Scholarship Fund. This gift was possible thanks to proceeds from the Club's annual Toffee Sales fundraiser of \$1,007 and pre-designated Scholarship contributions of \$745. As a reminder, our annual contribution to the Scholarship Fund is discretionary and based on our budget for that fiscal year. The Fund's market value as of June 30, 2012 was \$967,683. There were two student recipients in the 2011-2012 academic year.

Dr. Rowe discusses the factors that led a Shakespeare scholar into entrepreneurial publishing, resulting in her new app— Shakespeare's The Tempest. She ties the experiences of students using the app to how reading is changing in our digital world.

Accuracy is important, but memory is not history; in addition to accurate detail, the memoirist wants to unearth—and understand—the emotional truth.

Biology Professor Steven Williams + January 9, 2012

This year, Smith Gates Professor of Biology Steven Williams spoke at the annual College for a Day event on January 9th. He talked about neglected tropical diseases -- debilitating illnesses that impact the world's poorest populations. Dr. Williams also explained his current research to the attendees, focusing on his laboratory's efforts to further explore the molecular biology of the parasites that cause elephantiasis and African river blindness. His talk was relevant to current events and politics, as most of his research relates in one way or another to the goal of eliminating these diseases that afflict 200 million people worldwide. He also studies animal parasites that infect endangered wildlife.

A reception was held after the College for a Day event at the home of Melanie Grant, '61. It was a special evening with Smith alums, who got the opportunity to meet Dr. Williams, ask further questions about his work and research, and talk about his lecture and the college in general.
